Professor Maria Albin, is a physician and specialist in occupational and environmental medicine. She coordinated the research centre Medicine and Technology for Working Life and Society at Lund University 2007-2016. She is currently head of the Stockholm occupational and environmental medicine clinic, and full professor of occupational and environmental medicine at the Unit of Occupational Medicine, Institute for Environmental Medicine, Karolinska Institutet, Stockholm.

She currently directs two major research programs, Enabling participation, health and well-being of ageing workers: towards a sustainable and inclusive working life (<http://swaw.se/>) and A sustainable new working life: Trends, health effects and governance (<http://ki.se/en/imm/a-sustainable-new-working-life-trends-health-effects-and-governance>), and the advocacy platform Sustainable work as a resource for health, innovation and growth in EU's Horizon 2020 (<https://sustainablework2020.se/>). Professor Albin is a researcher representative in the advisory board of the Swedish Work Environment Authority.

Professor Albin was president of the Swedish Epidemiology Association, and of the Section of occupational and environmental medicine, Swedish Society of Medicine, and until its closure a member of the Swedish Criteria Group for Occupational Standards. She served in the Swedish Commission for Equity and Health (<http://kommissionjamlikhalsa.se/en/>), which presented its final report this year. The report pointed out work, working conditions, and the working environment, as one of seven crucial areas for equitable health.
